Internationalisation as Institutional Policy



The internationalisation and internationalisation at home (IaH) are mentioned in Prince of Songkla University's mission/strategic plan as follows: "To build academic leadership and innovation through research for developing the country in general and the southern region of Thailand in particular, creating a linkage to the society and global network" and "Promoting English proficiency development through several activities for staff and students at university and faculty level. And developing International programs to attract more foreign students to PSU". The IaH is seen as very important in the university. Furthermore, all informative means such as key institutional regulations, curricula, and training materials are published on the institution's website partially in English language.

Working with international and/or culturally and linguistically diverse groups in the local community

The main responsibility for internationalisation of the curriculum lies at the **department level**. On the other hand, the main responsibility for the extra-curricular activities for the IaH lies at the **international office** of the institution.

The questionnaire was prepared based on the IAU 5th Global Survey on Internationalisation of Higher Education and represents an adapted and shortened version of the global survey focusing predominantly on the issue of internationalisation at home.
